



SIXTH FORM ORGAN SCHOLARSHIP

One CLC Organ Scholarship per year is available for a pupil entering the Sixth Form, with auditions taking place in the Autumn of Year 11. Prospective candidates should be promising organists with a demonstrable commitment to the instrument and a desire to dedicate significant time to developing their skills in this area whilst at College.

The Organ Scholarship is open to current CLC girls, and those entering CLC for their sixth form studies. Internal students will have the opportunity to audition for a Scholarship at the same point in Year 11 (UC5) as the external applicants.

Applicants should have keyboard skills beyond the level of Grade 6 piano, preferably with confident sight-reading ability. Some previous experience of studying or playing the organ is essential.

The Sixth Form Organ Scholar will follow a discrete programme of training which could form ideal preparation for a University Organ Scholarship, and will include many performance opportunities at College and externally.

The Organ Scholar will receive free organ tuition in the form of two lessons per week in repertoire and keyboard / general musicianship skills and will also work closely with the College Organist

The purpose of our selection process is to evaluate potential, an ability to benefit from the opportunities available, and a commitment to contributing to the musical life of College.

Former CLC students have won Organ Scholarships at Oxbridge and University of St Andrews, and have continued organ studies in the USA.

HOW TO APPLY

The Organ Scholarship audition takes place on the 3-manual Kenneth Tickell organ in the Princess Hall.

The audition takes place the week commencing 6th November of Year 11 (UC5) to commence in September of Year 12 (SFC1).

The deadline for entry is **1st October 2023**.

The Head of Music is always pleased to hear from prospective candidates (contact details on application form). Second-study organists may wish to offer organ as part of a Music Scholarship application.

SCHOLARSHIP ASSESSMENT

The requirements for the SFC Organ Scholarship audition are as follows:

- Perform a piece of Bach with pedals
- Perform a second, contrasting piece
- Perform a Hymn of the candidate's choice (playover and 2 verses)
- A Quick Study piece (10 minutes preparation time)
- Sight-reading (1 minute preparation time)
- Aural tests
- Perform a short piano piece (optional)
- Discussion with Head of Music and the College Organist

EXPECTATIONS

The Organ Scholar will show significant dedication to personal practice and public performance and will be an advocate for the Organ.

The activities relating to the Organ Scholarship will be tailored to the individual according to personal goals and aspirations, and will include most of the following:

- Playing in Prayers every week (a hymn, prepared repertoire, quick study piece or improvisation)
- Attending Choir visits, workshops with local schools and occasional Sunday services
- Taking part in the annual organ recital
- Taking charge of the organ playing provision on some days, including assisting other students
- Conducting and accompanying of choirs
